3 PURPOSE

This PAIA Manual is useful for the public to:

- 3.1. check the categories of records held by a body which are available without a person having to submit a formal PAIA request;
- 3.2. have a sufficient understanding of how to make a request for access to a record of the body, by providing a description of the subjects on which the body holds records and the categories of records held on each subject;



- 3.3. know the description of the records of the body which are available in accordance with any other legislation;
- 3.4. access all the relevant contact details of the Information Officer and Deputy Information
 Officer who will assist the public with the records they intend to access;
- 3.5. know the description of the guide on how to use PAIA, as updated by the Regulator and how to obtain access to it;
- 3.6. know if the body will process personal information, the purpose of processing of personal information and the description of the categories of data subjects and of the information or categories of information relating thereto;
- 3.7. know the description of the categories of data subjects and of the information or categories of information relating thereto;
- 3.8. know the recipients or categories of recipients to whom the personal information may be supplied;
- 3.9. know if the body has planned to transfer or process personal information outside the Republic of South Africa and the recipients or categories of recipients to whom the personal information may be supplied; and
- 3.10. know whether the body has appropriate security measures to ensure the confidentiality, integrity and availability of the personal information which is processed.

6 GUIDE ON HOW TO USE PAIA AND HOW TO OBTAIN ACCESS TO THE GUIDE

- 6.1. The Regulator has, in terms of section 10(1) of PAIA, as amended, updated and made available the revised Guide on how to use PAIA ("Guide"), in an easily comprehensible form and manner, as may reasonably be required by a person who wishes to exercise any right contemplated in PAIA and POPIA.
- 6.2. The aforesaid Guide contains the description of-
 - 6.2.1. the objects of PAIA and POPIA;
 - 6.2.2. access to the postal and street address, phone and fax number and, if available, electronic mail address of-
 - 6.2.2.1. the Information Officer of every public body, and



- 6.2.2.2. every Deputy Information Officer of every public and private body designated in terms of section 17(1) of PAIA¹ and section 56 of POPIA²;
- 6.2.3. the manner and form of a request for-
 - 6.2.3.1. access to a record of a public body contemplated in section 11³; and
 - 6.2.3.2. access to a record of a private body contemplated in section 50^4 ;
- 6.2.4. the assistance available from the IO of a public body in terms of PAIA and POPIA;
- 6.2.5. the assistance available from the Regulator in terms of PAIA and POPIA;
- 6.2.6. all remedies in law available regarding an act or failure to act in respect of a right or duty conferred or imposed by PAIA and POPIA, including the manner of lodging-

¹ Section 17(1) of PAIA- For the purposes of PAIA, each public body must, subject to legislation governing the employment of personnel of the public body concerned, designate such number of persons as deputy information officers as are necessary to render the public body as accessible as reasonably possible for requesters of its records.

² Section 56(a) of POPIA- Each public and private body must make provision, in the manner prescribed in section 17 of the Promotion of Access to Information Act, with the necessary changes, for the designation of such a number of persons, if any, as deputy information officers as is necessary to perform the duties and responsibilities as set out in section 55(1) of POPIA.

³ Section 11(1) of PAIA- A requester must be given access to a record of a public body if that requester complies with all the procedural requirements in PAIA relating to a request for access to that record; and access to that record is not refused in terms of any ground for refusal contemplated in Chapter 4 of this Part.

⁴ Section 50(1) of PAIA- A requester must be given access to any record of a private body if-

a) that record is required for the exercise or protection of any rights;

b) that person complies with the procedural requirements in PAIA relating to a request for access to that record; and

c) access to that record is not refused in terms of any ground for refusal contemplated in Chapter 4 of this Part.



- 6.2.6.1. an internal appeal;
- 6.2.6.2. a complaint to the Regulator; and
- 6.2.6.3. an application with a court against a decision by the information officer of a public body, a decision on internal appeal or a decision by the Regulator or a decision of the head of a private body;
- 6.2.7. the provisions of sections 14⁵ and 51⁶ requiring a public body and private body, respectively, to compile a manual, and how to obtain access to a manual;
- 6.2.8. the provisions of sections 15⁷ and 52⁸ providing for the voluntary disclosure of categories of records by a public body and private body, respectively;
- 6.2.9. the notices issued in terms of sections 22⁹ and 54¹⁰ regarding fees to be paid in relation to requests for access; and

⁵ Section 14(1) of PAIA- The information officer of a public body must, in at least three official languages, make available a manual containing information listed in paragraph 4 above.

⁶ Section 51(1) of PAIA- The head of a private body must make available a manual containing the description of the information listed in paragraph 5 above.

⁷ Section 15(1) of PAIA- The information officer of a public body, must make available in the prescribed manner a description of the categories of records of the public body that are automatically available without a person having to request access

⁸ Section 52(1) of PAIA- The head of a private body may, on a voluntary basis, make available in the prescribed manner a description of the categories of records of the private body that are automatically available without a person having to request access

⁹ Section 22(1) of PAIA- The information officer of a public body to whom a request for access is made, must by notice require the requester to pay the prescribed request fee (if any), before further processing the request.

¹⁰ Section 54(1) of PAIA- The head of a private body to whom a request for access is made must by notice require the requester to pay the prescribed request fee (if any), before further processing the request.



- 6.2.10. the regulations made in terms of section 92^{11} .
- 6.3. Members of the public can inspect or make copies of the Guide from the offices of the public and private bodies, including the office of the Regulator, during normal working hours.
- 6.4. The Guide can also be obtained-
 - 6.4.1. upon request to the Information Officer;
- 6.5. from the website of the Regulator (https://inforegulator.org.za/)

7 REASONS FOR ACCESS REFUSAL

A private body such as CrossCheck Information Bureau is entitled to refuse a request for information.

- 7.1 The main grounds for CrossCheck Information Bureau to refuse a request for information relates to the:
 - 7.1.1 mandatory protection of the privacy of a third party who is a natural person or a deceased person (section 63 of PAIA) or a juristic person, as included in the POPIA which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of personal information of that natural or juristic person;

¹¹ Section 92(1) of PAIA provides that –"The Minister may, by notice in the Gazette, make regulations regarding-

⁽a) any matter which is required or permitted by this Act to be prescribed;

⁽b) any matter relating to the fees contemplated in sections 22 and 54;

⁽c) any notice required by this Act;

⁽d) uniform criteria to be applied by the information officer of a public body when deciding which categories of records are to be made available in terms of section 15; and

⁽e) any administrative or procedural matter necessary to give effect to the provisions of this Act."



- 7.1.2 mandatory protection of personal information and for disclosure of any personal information to, in addition to any other legislative, regulatory, or contractual agreements, comply with the provisions of the POPIA;
- 7.1.3 mandatory protection of the commercial information of a third party (section 64 of PAIA) if the record contains:
 - 7.1.3.1 trade secrets of the third party;
 - 7.1.3.2 financial, commercial, scientific, or technical information which disclosure could likely cause harm to the financial or commercial interests of that third party;
 - 7.1.3.3 information disclosed in confidence by a third party to CrossCheck Information Bureau if the disclosure could put that third party at a disadvantage in negotiations or commercial competition.
- 7.1.4 mandatory protection of confidential information of third parties (section 65 of PAIA) if it is protected in terms of any agreement;
- 7.1.5 mandatory protection of the safety of individuals and the protection of property (section 66 of PAIA); and/or
- 7.1.6 mandatory protection of records which would be regarded as privileged in legal proceedings (section 67 of PAIA).



- 7.2 The commercial activities (section 68 of PAIA) of a private body, such as CrossCheck Information Bureau, which may include:
 - 7.2.1 trade secrets of CrossCheck Information Bureau;
 - 7.2.2 financial, commercial, scientific, or technical information which disclosure could likely cause harm to the financial or commercial interests of CrossCheck Information Bureau;
 - 7.2.3 information which, if disclosed could put CrossCheck Information Bureau at a disadvantage in negotiations or commercial competition;
 - 7.2.4 a computer program which is owned by CrossCheck Information Bureau and which is protected by copyright; and/or
 - 7.2.5 the research information (section 69 of PAIA) of CrossCheck Information Bureau or a third party, if its disclosure would disclose the identity of CrossCheck Information Bureau, the researcher or the subject matter of the research and would place the research at a serious disadvantage.
- 7.3 Requests for information that are clearly frivolous or vexatious, or which involve an unreasonable diversion of resources shall be refused.
- 7.4 All requests for information will be assessed on their own merits and in accordance with the applicable legal principles and legislation.

If a requested record cannot be found or if the record does not exist, the Information Officer shall, by way of an affidavit or affirmation, notify the requester that it is not possible to give



access to the requested record. Such a notice will be regarded as a decision to refuse a request for access to the record concerned for the purpose of PAIA. If the record should later be found, the requester shall be given access to the record in the manner stipulated by the requester in the prescribed form, unless the Information Officer refuses access to such record.

You will be notified in writing on Form 3 as required by PAIA as to whether your request for information has been approved or denied within 30 (Thirty) calendar days after receipt of a completed request refer Form 2 as per Annexure A.



11.4 Objection of processing of personal information

A data subject who wishes to object to the processing of personal information by CrossCheck Information Bureau must submit the objection to CrossCheck Information Bureau at any time during office hours. There will be no charge for sending or receiving the objection.

The data subject must object using the prescribed Form 1 (POPIA) as depicted in the POPIA Regulations dated 17 April 2025 (Refer to Annexure D) or a substantially similar document made available to the data subject. The objection to the processing of personal information can be submitted to CrossCheck Information Bureau via hand, fax, post, e-mail, SMS or WhatsApp or another method agreed with CrossCheck Information Bureau. Refer to the contact details of CrossCheck Information Bureau stipulated in paragraph 3.1.

We have also uploaded POPIA Form 1 to our website for ease of reference.



When collecting personal identifiable information directly from a data subject as depicted in Section 18, CrossCheck Information Bureau will inform the data subject in terms of Section 18(1)(h)(iv) of POPIA, of their right to object to the processing of their personal information, as referred to in Section 11(3) of POPIA.

If an objection to the processing of personal information of a data subject is made telephonically, such an objection shall be electronically recorded by CrossCheck Information Bureau.

11.5 Correction or deletion of personal Information

CrossCheck Information Bureau acknowledge that the data subject has the right, to request, where necessary, the correction, destruction, or deletion of his, her or its personal information.

A data subject, who wishes to request the destruction or deletion of a record of his, her, or its personal information, in terms of section 24(1) (b) of the Act, has the right to request the destruction or deletion of a record of his, her or its personal information at any time. The request for destruction or deletion will be free of charge.

The data subject must request for a correction or deletion of personal information on Form 2 (POPIA) (Refer Annexure E) as depicted in the POPIA Regulations dated 17 April 2025. This will be free of charge. The correction or deletions of personal information can be submitted to CrossCheck Information Bureau via hand, fax, post, email, SMS, WhatsApp message or another method agreed with CrossCheck Information Bureau. Refer to the contact details of CrossCheck Information Bureau stipulated in paragraph 3.1.

A request for a correction or deletion of personal information by telephonic means shall be recorded by CrossCheck Information Bureau and such recording must, upon



request, will be made available to a data subject in any manner, including the transcription thereof which shall be free of charge.

We have also uploaded POPIA Form 2 to our website for easy reference.

On receipt of this request, and after CrossCheck Information Bureau have verified the identity of the data subject, we will provide the data subject with a record of the data subjects personal information that CrossCheck Information Bureau have. After evaluation we will then do the following:

- correct the information;
- destroy or delete the information;
- provide the data subject, to his or her satisfaction, with credible evidence in support of the information; or
- where agreement cannot be reached between CrossCheck Information Bureau
 and the data subject, and if the data subject so requests, take such steps as are
 reasonable in the circumstances, to attach to the information in such a manner
 that it will always be read with the information, an indication that a correction of
 the information has been requested but has not been made.

If the case where the data subject still don't agree with CrossCheck Information Bureau, the data subject has a right to refer the matter to the Information Regulator, refer paragraph 4.1 for the details of the Information Regulator.

CrossCheck Information Bureau will within thirty (30) days of receipt of the outcome of the request, notify a data subject, in writing, of the action taken as a result of the request.



11.6 Planned transborder flows of personal information

CrossCheck Information Bureau does not intend to transfer Personal Information outside of South Africa, but if it does, it will only do so to secure or back up such Personal Information or for technical reasons. If Personal Information is transferred outside of South Africa, CrossCheck Information Bureau will only transfer such Personal Information to other countries who have similar privacy and data protection laws as those in South Africa that provides an adequate level of protection, as required by section 72 of POPIA.

11.7 General description of Information Security Measures to be implemented by the responsible party to ensure the confidentiality, integrity and availability of the information

CrossCheck Information Bureau is committed to ensuring that personal and sensitive Information is secure. In order to prevent unauthorised access or disclosure to any Personal Information, CrossCheck Information Bureau has put in place suitable physical, electronic and managerial procedures to safeguard and secure the information it collects.

CrossCheck Information Bureau makes use of secure data transmission and storage technologies to reasonably protect personal and sensitive Information from unauthorised disclosure and to maintain the integrity of personal and sensitive Information. CrossCheck Information Bureau organisation takes all reasonable technical and organisational measures to ensure the security of Personal and sensitive Information.



CrossCheck Information Bureau have comprehensive information security policies and procedures and have implemented security measures the cover the following areas:

- 11.7.1 **Physical** Personal and sensitive information processed onsite and at reputable data centres in South Africa with the necessary physical measures in place;
- 11.7.2 Logical Only people that must have access to information/data to perform their tasks have the required access. Strong passwords are used to protect information/data that is classified as restricted/confidential;
- 11.7.3 **Operational** Anti-malware and anti-virus solutions are used; vulnerability tests are done and backups are made on a regular basis;
- 11.7.4 Employees Prospective employees have been screened before appointment. This includes reference checks and criminal checks. Employees are also trained in relation to policies and procedures as and when required.

12 INFORMATION WE HOLD TO COMPLY WITH THE LAW

Where applicable to its operations, CrossCheck Information Bureau also retains records and documents in terms of the legislation described below. Unless disclosure is prohibited in terms of legislation, regulations, contractual agreement or otherwise, records that are required to be made available in terms of these acts shall be made available for inspection by interested parties in terms of the requirements and conditions of the specific Act; the below mentioned legislation and applicable internal policies and procedures, should such interested parties be



entitled to such information. A person can request access by completing Form 2 as per the PAIA regulations (27 August 2021) (Refer Annexure A for example of Form 2).

It is further recorded that the accessibility of documents and records may be subject to the grounds of refusal set out in paragraph 6 of this Manual.

CrossCheck Information Bureau hold information in accordance with the following legislation:

- Basic Conditions of Employment Act, 75 of 1997;
- Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 53 of 2003;
- Companies Act, 71 of 2008;
- Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act, 130 of 1993;
- Competition Act, 89 of 1998;
- Constitution of the Republic of South Africa 1996;
